Cindy Stinson-Chennel — Cut Paper Creations

"After 30 years of teaching, I am retired in Oregon. My background in art education and educational media (both studied at Oregon College of Education, now Western Oregon University) led me to teaching in Europe and South America. When traveling in Switzerland, I discovered paper cutting.



While teaching and raising a family, I found cleaning up the snippings of paper much faster than all the materials of printmaking, which was my favored media. Yet the refining of the images was very similar. For over 35 years I have been snipping paper. It never fails to challenge and relax me at the same time."

- There will be a \$25.00 entry/hanging fee due when artwork is dropped off.
- The entries will not be juried in or out. All accepted art will be hung.
- The gallery reserves the right to not show submitted work. If a piece is not shown and is returned to the artist the \$25.00 entry fee will be refunded.

Dropping off your artwork:

- Drop off dates will be May 29 June 1 from 11 am to 4 pm.
- Each artist will complete a label for their artwork at the gallery.
- Each artist will complete a show agreement form and sign in their work in an inventory book. Gallery partners will be on hand to help and we will have more details coming soon.
- We will hang the show on June 2 and it will open June 5.
