The only problem was that she had to share it with all the other 5 year olds. A year or so later, moving with her parents from Tulsa to Wichita, she left that easel behind.

Still holding that vision of painting, she hovered around anything that even vaguely leaned toward art. She worked in a commercial print shop acquiring skills that would later serve her well. She did free-lance illustration and copy writing. She worked for the Forest Service; earning money to support her need to paint. Through marriage and divorce and another move, this time to Oregon, the easel was calling.

Then when there was a child to support, and wanting to be home when the school bus came, she started Watermark Signs where she painted signs and did general advertising. The tag line was "Where Fine Art and Advertising Collide". When her son was fully grown and she no longer needed to be regulated by the school bus schedule she converted the sign shop into a painting studio and moved an etching press in to share the space with an easel.

She still lives there in rural Western Oregon, now with her husband, Harry Lehman, their two dogs, a flock of sheep, a garden and fruit trees. That 10 acres is her muse.

She can walk right out the door and be at the easel all to herself. The kindergarten dream come true!

Her work is currently in The Art About Agriculture Touring exhibit and at River Gallery where she is a partner.


